The aim of the Association is to encourage the registration and breeding of sound, healthy animals with no physical defects that might affect future generations. This form will assist in identifying animals with such defects. The MMDA will retain the right to refuse entry to the Stud Book for any donkey failing this inspection. Miniature Mediterranean Donkeys that fail this inspection are still eligible for application to the General Register.

The veterinary surgeon is asked to use his/her best judgment to decide if this donkey has any severe or inherited faults that might prevent it from being entered into the MMDA Stud Book with a view to being used for breeding.

The veterinary surgeon is asked to complete the form which must then be sent by the owner to the MMDA registrar with the appropriate Registration Update Form for application to the Stud Register.

IMPORTANT: Microchip and height details on page 1 and all of page 2 must be completed and signed off by an Equine Veterinary Surgeon.
